Supporting the Work at Bulabakulu Children's Village, Uganda

The History of Bulabakulu Village

Joshua Magezi, who pastors a large church in Kampala, was challenged by the problem of widows and orphans with no means of support.

A 10 acre plot of was acquired near Wakiso, a small town around 14km from the centre of Kampala - and the first widow moved there in 1997.



Initially, traditional mud huts were constructed from materials harvested from the site.

By 2011 there were around 110 children, living at Bulabakulu and this has now increased to somewhere around 250. Not all of these are orphans but all are in dire need.

The housing and other buildings and facilities have gradually increased with the emphasis now very much on more permanent structures with concrete floors, rendered walls and corrugated iron roofs.



Education

A primary school has been built in the village - largely between 2005 and 2008. AGLMUK has played an important role by funding the building project, contributing to teacher's salaries and purchasing resources. The school is now partially self-supporting by accepting fee-paying students but external support is still essential.



As students grew older it became necessary to support them as they left primary education. This has been achieved through a combination of secondary school education, vocational training and, in a few cases, university courses. This support for older students has largely been achieved via direct support from individual UK sponsors. There are around 50 secondary school students receiving support via AGLMUK at present.

Food and Other Running Costs

£10 per month will feed a child at Bulabakulu but this means that £2,000 has to be raised every month!

AGLMUK is grateful for any donations however small (or large!) towards food, primary education, high school and vocational education.

All funds received go to the work at Bulabakulu. Nothing is taken for administration or travel. All work in the UK is done by volunteers.
