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FOOD - A New Era Starts

AGLMUK has been assisting AGLM for a period approaching ten years but over that period we have never been the ones with the primary task of providing that most basic of requirements food. In the early years it was the Ugandan Child

Development Fund that had undertaken to provide money for food. A group based in Corsham in Wiltshire took over and whilst, in the past couple of years they have been routing their money through AGLMUK, it was still via



largely independent fundraising heroics. Just as the Corsham group was starting to struggle keep going with their amazing achievements, the Bernie Project (based in the USA) took up the slack. We told you about the Bernie Project this time last year and it has provided the majority of the food at Bulabakulu over that period. The children and young people at Bulabakulu owe a huge debt of gratitude to UCDF, the Corsham Group and the Bernie Project, without whom life would have been very miserable indeed over the last 8-10 years.

We have been informed that the Bernie Project will not be supporting Bulabakulu at all from the end of October. AGLMUK had already committed to providing food for November and so the "problem" does not really kick-in until the start of December.

Rising to the Challenge

At a time like this it is tempting for the trustees and supporters of AGLMUK to feel over-whelmed by the challenge. There are 200 children and young people at Bulabakulu and whilst Joshua and Barry are working on ways to bring in income or grow significant quantities of food, these are some way off yielding results. The monthly food bill (for a very basic diet that consists almost exclusively of poshu and beans) is around £2,000. That is £24,000 per year.

At the meeting when we discussed the issue we reminded ourselves of some basic truths. It is not our project and we are there to support Joshua and AGLM.

We serve a God who has a real heart for widows and orphans and we need to trust him.

Our current plan is to try to find the money for food for December, January and February. This will buy us enough time to visit the village, meet with Joshua and come up with a plan. As part of this approach we have decided to switch all of our "alternative gift" effort towards food. We have come up with the notion of the "Alternative Christmas Dinner". Don't panic - we are not asking you to eat poshu and beans instead of roast turkey. When you are planning your festive spread we would like you to consider buying another meal for someone at Bulabakulu. You could even set a vacant chair around the table as a reminder that you



have sent money to feed a child in Uganda. Some may like an alternative - go without brussel sprouts and donate the savings! The standard alternative Christmas present idea is, of course, available and we can provide other options but we really want to push "food". We would really love it too, if people would consider sponsoring food for a child at £10 per month. £2,000 a month sounds a lot - but not when it is realised that this is only £10 per mouth.
