Exchange Rate - POST EU EXIT VOTE

As you can see on the graph below, the exchange rate took a steep dive after the result of the EU referendum was declared. We had been used to getting a little over 5,000 Ugandan Shillings to the UK Pound and now it is less than 4,500. This makes everything that we buy in Uganda a lot more expensive than it was at the start of the year.

This clearly demonstrates that running a

charity that spends most of its income outside of the country in which it is raised, has an extra element of uncertainty when it comes to required expenditure.

There is no panic and the funds are there to cover the planned expenditure in the short-term. The shock to our system does remind us that exchange rates make an enormous difference to just how far the money that is raised will stretch.



Up-date on Food Situation

The provision of food for the village during 2016 was a commitment that trustees were able to make when they were at Bulabakulu in February. As the article above suggests, the cost of this commitment in sterling has risen significantly (by around £200 a month at the moment) but there are enough reserves to cover the current commitment.

The situation will be discussed again when the trustees of AGLMUK meet with the leaders of AGLM early in 2017. The ability of the AGLMUK trustees to commit to funding all food supplies in 2017 will depend upon the situation at the time. The



income dedicated to food costs is less than half of what is required and so the remainder comes from general fund-raising. Thanks to everyone that has contributed via regular or one-off donations.

Charity Shop Week

AGLMUK rented the community charity shop in Llandrindod Wells again in July on this year. Thanks to the large number of volunteers who manned the shop, a very welcome £1,700 was raised for Bulabakulu. The premises (which are in great demand from charities) have been

booked for a week at the end of October 2017. Some people seem to thrive as retailers but none of AGLMUK trustees fall into this category - we are therefore very grateful for the volunteers without whom this significant opportunity would "go begging".
