Response to Pandemic

Covid-19 is certainly having its impact in Uganda, particularly urban, densely-packed Kampala. Bulabakulu is close to Wakiso Town which itself is now pretty much part of greater Kampala. As far as we know no-one associated with AGLM has caught the virus but every one of them has been impacted by strict lockdown measures. The ability to earn has been curtailed for most



and there have been no furlough schemes or the like to replace lost income. AGLMUK's first



response came courtesy of a grant from the Welsh Government's WalesAfrica programme (administered by the Welsh Council for Voluntary Action). We were able to send £2,250 to enable Barry, Joseline and Harriet to distribute food and soap to 366 people in 68 families. For more information see the special report on the web site.

Having seen the effective way in which our wonderful team managed to get vital help out to families in dire need, AGLMUK sent further funding for similar food and soap parcels for delivery to families in need. A fund has also been provided for Joseline and Barry to administer that provides one-off hardship grants to young men and women that used to be part of our programme but now considered to be independent.

With the pandemic clearly not going away any time soon we should be planning on a pre-Christmas food

delivery too. It won't be a "turkey dinner" but whatever is managed will be very gratefully received. If you think that you can help us make this food parcel at bit less basic then please get in touch.

Closure of Schools and Churches

At about the same time as the UK went into lock-down, Uganda followed a similar pattern but, unlike the UK schools have remained closed ever since. It is only on October 15th that educational establishments will re-open for students in exam years only (P7, S4, S6 and final year college and university). On-line learning is being encouraged but hardly anyone has a laptop! It is also interesting that churches are allowed to re-open for up to 70 people at a time but Sunday school is still closed. The impact upon this large generation of children is massive as most of them are set to lose a year's education.

Godfrey Leads by Example

Rather than sit around waiting for his university course to recommence, Godfrey has decided to use skills that he has accumulated along the way to keep busy and earn his keep. With a bit of help from AGLMUK Godrey has set up a small business fixing motor bikes (or boda-bodas as they are called in Uganda). Well done Godfrey, your initiative is applauded.

The trustees will discuss the options for a trip in 2022 and will make sure that any opportunities there may be are highlighted in the next newsletter—which will be due in March 2021.


Helping with House Repairs?

Whilst we were in Uganda we decided to spend the money that had been allocated for maintenance on some improvements/ repairs to a couple of local houses occupied by families very much within the AGLM programme. our attention to the fact that it is in a very poor state of repair. The trustees are considering moving the funds that used to be used for "maintenance" of the Wakiso School of Hope buildings to urgent repairs of houses in the "AGLM family".
